

GEIS is situated in West Auckland, in the picturesque suburb of Titirangi, at the foot of the Waitakere Ranges. This is part of Auckland City, and was home of the 2011 Rugby World Cup. Auckland is New Zealand's largest city and home to more than 1 million people from a wide variety of cultures. GEIS is 20 minutes from the CBD in Auckland. It is surrounded by native bush, close to the famous black sand beaches, and internationally acclaimed golf courses. Titirangi Township is our local friendly village and there are also a number of Shopping Malls close by.

There are a small number of International Students which means only one International Student is placed per homeroom class.

Students have the opportunity to attend **small group English tuition** in the International room, as well as attending their regular classes.

International links with Sister Schools in China, Japan, South Korea and Thailand reinforce for our students the concept of Globalisation in the 21st Century.

Students at GEIS are offered a broad curriculum that focuses on key learning areas within the New Zealand Curriculum. These are complemented by a wide range of specialisation, performing and visual arts, sports and education outside the classroom. Students are valued and encouraged. They enjoy learning and take advantage of leadership opportunities. Understanding the academic and social needs of 21st century learners is important to us and our goal is to meet the individual needs of each child including our International Students.

We have:

- A well resourced school with modern facilities; these include: an auditorium, full sized gymnasium, all weather artificial turf, 25m heated swimming pool, Television Studio (Cactus TV), Radio Station, School Tuckshop, Science Room and Library;
- · Dedicated and highly qualified staff;
- A wide range of academic, cultural and sporting experiences;
- A comprehensive speciallist programme based around the Arts and Technology. These include Video Production, Design Technology, Hard Materials, Visual Arts, Dramatic Arts, Textiles, Food Technology and Music;
- BYOD The curriculum is delivered using a variety of pedagogical models including the use of digital technologies. Students have the option of bringing their own Portable Device to be used to support their learning.

Professional and highly educated families populate our community and make caring homestay families. These families embrace our International Students and their culture.

Staying with friendly and welcoming families is paramount. This is essential for students to do well academically and to enjoy their time in New Zealand.

Homestay families treat students as one of their own and always provide a safe physical and emotional environment – 'a home away from home.'

Arrangements for homestays are organised and monitored directly by the International Student Director, ensuring the safety and well being of all students placed in homestays.

All homestay families are safety checked, police vetted and regular visits are made by the International Student Director.

Students in a homestay situation become part of their "Kiwi" family and experience the New Zealand way of life.

GEIS makes the Pastoral Care of its students a priority. The International Room has both an International Student Director and an ESOL Teacher. Both teachers are responsible for the Pastoral care and academic progress of each student.


Pastoral care is essential in ensuring the students are making progress. The International Student Director, Mrs Lesley King, meets regularly with the students to ensure that they are both happy at school and in their home environment. First language support and first language counselling are also available for International Students. All students receive their own Emergency card containing their personal details and 24/7 Emergency contacts.

Each student is assigned two "Kiwi" buddies prior to arrival. These buddies help the International Students settle in and become part of school life in New Zealand. In addition they have access to the International Student Room. This provides a place where the students can communicate in their first language, use email, meet with other International students, seek assistance and heat their traditional food for lunch. While the International Student Room is available to International Students, time spent with their "Kiwi buddies" is prioritized throughout the day.

Students receive small group or individual English tuition depending on the level of English proficiency when they arrive at GEIS.

Parents and Agents are also welcome to contact the International Director at any time via phone or email.
